Time to strengthen EU-UK cooperation by linking the EU and UK ETS

The signatories of this letter welcome the efforts to strengthen the EU-UK cooperation which is of increased importance, given the current geopolitical context and uncertainty over global trade policy. The EU and the UK also share similar commitments and ambitions for climate neutrality and mitigating climate change, each with its own legally binding target to achieve net zero emissions by 2050. Effective and efficient international trade and co-operation between the UK and the EU is key if we are to maximise the benefits of the North Sea, ensure affordable and secure energy for European consumers and industries and deliver on net zero targets.

Today, industries across Europe are facing increasing costs and fierce global competition. Stronger EU-UK cooperation could bring substantial benefits for European consumers and industries both in terms of cost and emissions reduction. A 2024 Baringa study¹ shows the benefits of real and effective North Sea coordination between the UK and the EU, notably by linking the EU and UK Emission Trading Systems (ETS) and addressing trade barriers. Effective coordination would save consumers up to €44bn per year by 2040 from lower electricity costs and it would decrease emissions by circa 24% in 2040. This would bring common benefits for both the EU and the UK.

We believe that negotiations on linking the UK and EU ETS's should start as soon as practicable. The UK-EU Trade and Cooperation Agreement states that the EU and UK shall “*give serious consideration to linking their respective carbon pricing systems in a way that preserves the integrity of these systems and provides for the possibility to increase their effectiveness*”. Given the similarities between the two Emissions Trading Systems, linking the two schemes should be technically and legally relatively straightforward.
